### RECYCLING COMMITTEE

The Recycling and Solid Waste Committee is comprised of all volunteer residents of Bow. Meetings are held the 1st Tuesday of each month, at 7:00 pm at the Municipal Building. The Committee serves as a sounding board for the community for matters dealing with recycling and solid waste. The committee's regular duties include:

- Sending Welcome Letters to new homeowners in town, including information about trash and recycling
- Coordinating the Town's Household Hazardous Waste Day collection, including review of bid proposals and assistance to obtain state grants (up to \$2,500) to defray part of the collection costs.
- Sponsoring of Compost Bin sales to help homeowners reduce trash while deriving a useful natural fertilizer for their gardens.
- Promoting Recycling and Conservation Education in Bow Schools through the annual Community Read-In, maintaining Teacher's resource informational binders, and supporting school recycling efforts.
- Coordinating recycling for Town ball fields and Community Center activities.

### HOLIDAY SCHEDULE

Within the holiday week, trash collection will occur on schedule on the days preceding the holiday. Collections scheduled for the holiday, as well as the remainder of the week will be delayed one day. When a holiday falls on a Friday, Saturday, or Sunday, there will be no impact on the collection schedule.

*Ex: Thanksgiving falls on a Thursday. Customers with scheduled collections Monday through Wednesday of that week will not be affected. Thursday's collections will occur on Friday, & Friday's collections will occur on Saturday.*

#### Collection will be delayed for the following holidays:

- 4th of July
- Labor Day
- Thanksgiving
- Christmas Day

## HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE & ELECTRONICS RECYCLING DAY SATURDAY, OCTOBER 3RD • 9:00 AM - 1:00 PM

**Bow Community Building** (Intersection of Logging Hill, Bow Center & Knox Roads)

Bring any of the following for NO CHARGE (Fees will apply for electronics):

**AUTOMOTIVE:** auto batteries, brake, transmission & power steering fluid, antifreeze

**BATTERIES:** rechargeable & NiCad and other batteries containing heavy metals.

**CLEANERS:** drain & oven cleaners, degreasers, metal polishers, rug & upholstery cleaners, disinfectants, ammonia, air fresheners

**COMPACT FLORESCENT LIGHTBULBS (BROKEN):** contain broken bulbs in lidded glass jar and store in nonliving area (ie in garage) until hazardous waste day.

**ELECTRONICS (fees apply):** all computer components, printers, cellular and regular telephones, TVs & other electronics (VCRs, DVD players, etc.)

**MERCURY THERMOMETERS & THERMOSTATS:** thermometers can be exchanged for a new digital one.

**PAINTS:** oil paint lacquer, stains, and other finishes paint removers, turpentine, furniture strippers

**PESTICIDES/INSECTICIDES:** for pets, pests, yards/gardens

**SNEAKERS:** for recycling into playground surfaces. Any brand, no metal parts.

**OTHER:** household chemicals (e.g., toxic glues), pool chemicals, driveway sealer

#### \*\*\* DO NOT BRING THE FOLLOWING \*\*\*

Latex paint or household alkaline batteries (these go in regular curbside trash); used motor oil (bring to Concord transfer station or Bow Landscape), propane tanks, building materials & air conditioners (bring to Concord Transfer Station); computer printer cartridges (bring to Bow Middle School), prescription drugs (go in regular trash), explosives, radioactive wastes, asbestos products and medical wastes (require special handling).



## RECYCLING INFORMATION

These materials should be placed in a recycling bin or barrel. Please remember that 80% of your discarded items are made up of the materials listed below. You are encouraged to remove these items from your general trash and help save the Town substantial solid waste costs which are funded from your tax dollars.

### PAPER PRODUCTS

#### What Can Be Recycled:

Newspaper	Paper Bags
Cereal Boxes	Catalogues

#### How To Prepare It:

- Do not place paper to be recycled in plastic bags.
- Cardboard should be flattened and no bigger than 2 feet wide & 3 feet long. Ripped into smaller pieces is acceptable.
- Shredded paper should be placed in a paper bag with top folded down, or put under other objects so as to not blow away and cause litter.

#### Unacceptable Items Do Not Recycle The Following:

- Waxed paper
- Soiled paper
- Used tissues

### COMMINGLED CONTAINERS

#### What Can Be Recycled:

- All plastic containers #1-#7 (*beverage containers, tubs, laundry detergent containers, etc.*)
- Plastic shopping bags (must be marked #1 - #7) stuffed into each other (see below)
- Clear, brown, green, & blue glass containers used for foods and beverages ONLY
- Tin and steel cans
- Metal lids to jars or bottles
- All aluminum cans & pet food cans
- Aluminum foil, disposable pie tins, & aluminum baking trays



#### How To Prepare It:

- Keep all plastic, metal, and glass in the same bin or barrel, but separate from paper products.
- Plastic shopping bags (marked #1 - #7) should be scrunched up and stuffed into other plastic shopping bags (the "bag of bags"). If possible place under heavier objects to prevent litter.
- Aluminum foil must be rinsed clean of debris

#### Unacceptable Items Do Not Recycle The Following:

- Needles
- Foam Rubber
- Light Bulbs (ESPECIALLY FLUORESCENTS)
- Ovenware, Ceramics
- Styrofoam
- Containers for hazardous or toxic materials (paint, rat poison, gasoline, etc.)
- Propane Tanks
- Window Panes
- Appliances

#### New Law: Fluorescents & Mercury-Containing Items

As of January 1st, 2008 New Hampshire State Law prohibits throwing items containing mercury (thermometers, thermostats, fluorescent bulbs) into the trash. Mercury is a very toxic substance and requires special handling.

**KEEP FLUORESCENT BULBS, COMPACT FLUORESCENT BULBS, THERMOMETERS, AND THERMOSTATS OUT OF YOUR TRASH!**

# IMPORTANT INFORMATION ON AUTOMATED TRASH COLLECTION

## Guidelines for Automated Trash Collection

Please read this resident user guide completely. It contains important program information

- All trash should be bagged and placed in the automated collection cart issued by the Town.
- Additional trash for pickup that won't fit in the cart should be placed curbside in such a manner as to not block the automated collection of your toter.
- Collection cart lids should be closed.
- Collection carts must be set in an accessible location: At least 5 feet from any obstruction such as trees, telephone poles, parked cars, mailboxes, recycling bins and barrels, etc. Approximately 2 feet from the curb and away from low hanging utility lines.
- Trash carts may be placed in groups of two, where applicable.
- Carts that are inaccessible will not be serviced until the following week.
- The cart must be placed so that the handle faces the house.
- All carts must be at the curb **by 7:00 AM** on your trash day.
- No hazardous or building materials, yard waste, brush, or recyclables should be placed in trash carts.
- Recycling bins and barrels should be placed on the curb itself so as to not interfere with the trash collection process.
- All recycling bins and barrels must be at the curb **by 7:00 AM** on your trash day.
- Recycling bins may be up to 32 gallons in capacity, there is no limit to the number of recycling bins or barrels you may use.

## Carts for Automated Collection

Bow residents have a wheeled cart that can be used for the automated collection program. Additional trash that will not fit in the cart may also be placed curbside in a manner as to not interfere with the automated collection (see diagram below). This cart is the property of the Town of Bow and should not be defaced or modified in any way. You are encouraged to remove all the recyclable items out of your regular trash. This will reduce the volume in your trash significantly. The recyclables you remove save the Town of Bow a substantial amount of money; money which comes out of your taxes!

## Missing or Damaged Carts

If for some reason the cart is destroyed, a new cart will be provided free of charge upon the return of the damaged cart. Missing carts will be replaced upon notification to the Town. Damaged carts will be repaired at no cost to the resident. Please contact the Bow Department of Public Works with the nature of the needed repair (lid, wheel, etc.):

## Proper Placement for Curbside Collection

- Place recycling bins and barrels on curb
- Place collection cart 2 feet from curb, and at least 5 feet from any obstruction (ie. parked car or tree).

On one way streets, carts should be placed on the right-hand side of the street.
